QUESTION: How many months do you foresee the design phase taking?

RESPONSE: We would expect suppliers to provide an implementation plan in their final proposal. At this stage we envisage the design phase would take between 3 and 5 months.

QUESTION: By taking on this first stage of the project to define the terms of reference and tender documents for establishing and operating the first phase of FONERWA, would a supplier disqualify themselves from the second phase?

RESPONSE: Participation in the first stage would not disqualify a supplier from also delivering stage 2. However if an open tender process is chosen for stage 2, no special treatment will be given to the supplier for stage 1.
