





CDKN's approach to knowledge brokering



Outline of the call

Why did we launch this knowledge-to-action call?

- Local people have the knowledge, experience and capacity to develop and implement their own effective resilience solutions.
- There is an urgent need to put local and marginalised people at the centre
 of climate-resilient action, so that individuals and communities can shape
 their own responses to the climate challenge.
- This call aims to support locally-led climate-resilient action across the themes of gender equity and social inclusion, finance for resilience, ecosystem-based approaches, enhancing climate literacy and empowering young people in Africa.



What are we looking for?

- Projects should support locally-led climate-resilient action and be locally-led.
- Be aligned with the themes of gender equity and social inclusion, finance for resilience, ecosystem-based approaches, enhancing climate literacy and empowering young people.
- Must integrate gender equity and social inclusion.
- Lead organisations must be based in Africa. Further preference will be given to African organisations.
- At least one organisation must have an established presence in the locality in which the project is based.

Alignment with CDKN themes	20%
Gender equity and social inclusion	20%
Sustainability	20%
Realistic scope	10%





Review and timelines

Review process and timelines

- 29 March 07 May 2023: Open call for proposals.
- 08 May 31 May:
 - assess according to basic eligibility. If ineligible, projects will not be considered for review
 - each eligible concept will be assessed by at least two reviewers
 - external reviewers will be part of the review team
 - a shortlist will be decided in discussion amongst reviewers and the CDKN leadership team.
- June: Shortlisted concepts will be asked to submit a longer proposal.
- July: Final selection of up to 5 projects.








