Please elaborate your answers as you get into character! Share your character's thoughts and feelings with the group.



A Disaster Management Officer from the City Government comes knocking.

Why didn't you come to the neighbourhood meeting about the floods? You work late and reach home very tired, at home you are responsible for teaching your children, so you don't have time. You usually get information from friends.

How have the floods affected you and what would improve your situation? You explain that the information about flood risks is very poor, but you pick up what news is available – you have TV, radio, mobile phone and laptop. Your office is far away and even on a normal day, it's difficult to reach home as a result of severe traffic jams. When it floods, the water makes it even harder to move around the neighbourhood and you are afraid your lack of mobility could cost you your job – you can't afford to lose it. At home, your wife complains about both the increasing price of food – and the high price of bottled water that you are buying, in order to try

and keep the family safe.
